FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The Idaho Junior Golf Foundation helps provide assistance to any junior unable to afford tournament entry fees.

Please contact the Idaho Junior Tour for more information about the application process. Once applications are received, the Idaho Junior Golf Foundation committee will determine if, and to what amount of financial assistance is to be granted.

The Idaho Junior Golf Foundation has the right to deny any application without notice.

MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

Idaho Junior Tour membership is open to boys and girls age eight up to their nineteenth birthday or the day they enter college, whichever comes first.

Membership dues are paid annually and are non-refundable. Membership is valid from date of purchase until December 31 of that year. No pro-rated fees for partial year memberships or family discounts are available. There is no discount or pro-rated fees for juniors that purchased a Youth on Course membership before becoming an Idaho Junior Tour member. You must be a registered member before registering for tournaments or events.

Membership includes an active GHIN number to track the player's handicap index. If a player currently holds a GHIN number, IGA will reactive it through the "Idaho Junior Tour". If a member did not previously have GHIN number, the IGA will issue a new number. See GHIN and Handicap Index Section of this handbook.

YOUTH ON COURSE

Idaho Junior Tour members will receive a Youth on Course membership. Each member's GHIN number will also serve as his/her YOC membership number. Players must complete the online "Life Skills Certification" curriculum before participating in Youth on Course initiatives. Once this is complete, juniors may create their profile on the Youth on Course app. After a profile has been created, juniors can use their membership at participating facilities to play golf for no more than \$5.00 during stipulated rounds.

GHIN NUMBER & HANDICAP INDEX

Having a GHIN number and a handicap index is an important part of the game. First, it allows players to track progress as skills improve and scores lower. Second, players of different skill levels can fairly compete against one another in net tournaments and informal games.

During tournament play members with similar handicap indexes will be paired together with the intention of playing with someone of a similar playing ability. Players that have not posted a minimum of five 18 hole rounds to their GHIN number will show up as an "NH". Players with an "NH" will be paired together. There is then a chance that the player will be paired with someone of either a higher or lower playing ability.

The Idaho Junior Tour will post all tournament rounds to players GHIN numbers. All non-IJT rounds shall be posted by the player. This can be done through the GHIN mobile app or www.ghin.com.

IDAHO JUNIOR TOUR SERIES

The Idaho Junior Tour membership is open to boys and girls age eight up to their nineteenth birthday or the day they enter college, whichever comes first. The division that a junior will be playing in, is determined by the age they are on June 1st.

The Idaho Junior Tour is made up of three different tours:

- **The Prep Tour**
 - Open to boys and girls age 8-12
 - Juniors play 9-holes
- **The Championship Tour**
 - Open to boys and girls age 13-18
 - Juniors play 18-holes
- **The Masters Tour**
 - Open to boys and girls age 13-18
 - Juniors play 36-holes
 - Handicap requirements

PREP TOUR

Juniors playing on the Prep tour will be playing 9-holes of golf. This tour is open to boys and girls age 8-12.

Age Divisions & Yardage

Girls 8-9 | 2,000-2,500

Boys 8-9 | 2,000-2,500

Girls 10-12 | 2,000-2,500

Boys 10-12 | 2,000-2,500

Walking Scorers/Caddies

Caddies are not allowed on the Idaho Junior Tour. All juniors must carry or push their bags on their own. Parents and spectators must not push or carry juniors bags at any time during the round. Parents and spectators must not help with club selection, advice giving or rulings. Each pairing group will be accompanied by a volunteer official walking scorekeeper (parents will be asked to fill this role). All players will be required to have one adult be a scorekeeper at one event.

The IGA office will then select the adult who will be the official scorekeeper for each group. Official walking scorers will be announced when tee times are released three to five days prior to the event. When selected to be an official walking scorer, please arrive 15 minutes before your tee time and check-in with registration or at the first tee you will then be given your official "walking scorer" badge, and scorecard/policies sheet.

Qualifying adults: if a parent is unable to fulfill this requirement you may supply another adult: grandparent, aunt, uncle, or other adult approved by IGA staff.

Stroke Limit

A ten stroke limit per hole is in effect for all players playing on the Prep Tour and Championship Tour. On any hole, players are allowed to take a maximum of ten strokes, including penalty strokes.

Juniors playing in the 10-12 division at the Idaho Junior Am will continue to play under the Max 10 limit.

PREP TOUR CONTINUED

District Championship

Juniors **MUST** play in **THREE** Idaho Junior Tour events to be eligible to play in the District Championship. Starting **July 1st** juniors that have played in three eligible events will be approved to the District Championship. **Juniors can register for the District Championship starting March 1st, but will be put on a pending list until July 1st or until they have played in three events, whichever comes first.*

Juniors playing in the 8-9 division will conclude their season at the District Championship.

Juniors playing in the 10-12 division will be able to earn a spot in the Idaho Junior Am, if they have not already earned a spot through player of the year points.

Idaho Junior Am

Juniors playing in the 10-12 division will have a chance to earn a spot in the Idaho Junior Am.

Qualifying for the Idaho Junior Am is determined by:

- Diamond Line Player of the Year point standings
 - This is determined after the last regular season event has been played
- Qualifying at the District Championship

CHAMPIONSHIP TOUR

Juniors playing on the Championship Tour will be playing 18-holes of golf. This tour is open to boys and girls age 13-18.

Age Divisions & Yardage

Girls 13-14 | 5,000-5,600

Boys 13-14 | 5,400-6,200

Girls 15-18 | 5,400-6,200

Boys 15-18 | 5,800-6,800

Caddies

Caddies are not allowed on the Idaho Junior Tour. All juniors must carry or push their bags on their own. Parents and spectators must not push or carry juniors bags at any time during the round. Parents and spectators must not help with club selection, advice giving or rulings.

Parent Volunteers

Parents of juniors playing on the Championship Tour will be required to act as a volunteer at least one event.

The IGA offices will select when the parent will be an official volunteer. Unless the parent has notified the IGA office of when they can perform the task. Volunteer assignments will be announced when tee times are released three to five days prior to the event.

Qualifying adults: if a parent is unable to fulfill this requirement you may supply another adult: grandparent, aunt, uncle, or other adult approved by IGA staff.

Stroke Limit

A ten stroke limit per hole is in effect for all players playing on the Prep Tour and the Championship Tour. On any hole, players are allowed to take a maximum of 10 strokes, including penalty strokes.

Juniors playing in the 13-14 and 15-18 divisions at the Idaho Junior Am will not be playing under the Max 10 limit. All strokes will be counted at the Idaho Junior Am for these divisions only.

CHAMPIONSHIP TOUR CONTINUED

District Championship

Juniors **MUST** play in **THREE** Idaho Junior Tour events **OR** either **ONE** Majors Event and **TWO** Idaho Junior Tour events to be eligible to play in the District Championship.

Starting **July 1st** juniors that have played in three eligible events will be approved to the District Championship. **Juniors can register for the District Championship starting March 1st, but will be put on a pending list until July 1st or until they have played in three events, whichever comes first.*

Juniors playing in the Championship Tour will be able to earn a spot in the Idaho Junior Am through the District Championship, if they have not already earned a spot through player of the year points.

Idaho Junior Am

Juniors playing in the Championship Tour will have a chance to continue on to the Idaho Junior Am. At the Idaho Junior Am they will play 54-holes over three days with a 36-hole cut.

Qualifying for the Idaho Junior Am is determined by:

- Diamond Line Player of the Year point standings
 - This is determined after the last regular season event has been played
- Qualifying at the District Championship
- Being in the top 500 on Junior Golf Scoreboard or AJGA Rankings as of July 4, 2025

MASTERS TOUR

Juniors playing on the Masters Tour will be playing 36-holes of golf. This tour is open to boys and girls age 13-18.

Age Divisions, Yardage & Handicap Limit

Girls 13-18 | 5,600-6,200 | Max HCP 10.0

Boys 13-18 | 6,600-6,800 | Max HCP 10.0

Caddies

Caddies are not allowed on the Idaho Junior Tour. All juniors must carry or push their bags on their own. Parents and spectators must not push or carry juniors bags at any time during the round. Parents and spectators must not help with club selection, advice giving or rulings.

Parent Volunteers

Parents of juniors playing on the Masters Tour will be required to act as a volunteer at least one event.

The IGA offices will select when the parent will be an official volunteer. Unless the parent has notified the IGA office of when they can perform the task. Volunteer assignments will be announced when tee times are released three to five days prior to the event.

Qualifying adults: if a parent is unable to fulfill this requirement you may supply another adult: grandparent, aunt, uncle, or other adult approved by IGA staff.

Stroke Limit

Juniors playing in the Masters Tour will not be playing under the Max 10 limit. All strokes will be counted at all Masters Tour events.

Junior Golf Scoreboard & AJGA Rankings

Masters Tour events will be Junior Golf Scoreboard ranked and eligible for AJGA stars.

MASTERS TOUR CONTINUED

District Championship

Juniors **MUST** play in **ONE Masters Tour** event **AND** either **ONE Major Event** or **ONE Idaho Junior Tour** event to be eligible to play in the District Championship.

Starting July 1st juniors that have played in eligible events will be approved to the District Championship. **Juniors can register for the District Championship starting March 1st, but will be put on a pending list until July 1st or until they have played in eligible events, whichever comes first.*

Juniors playing in the Masters Tour will be able to earn a spot in the Idaho Junior Am through the District Championship, if they have not already earned a spot through player of the year points.

Idaho Junior Am

Juniors playing in the Masters Tour will have a chance to continue on to the Idaho Junior Am. At the Idaho Junior Am they will play 54-holes over three days with a 36-hole cut.

Qualifying for the Idaho Junior Am is determined by:

- Boy and Girl Champions of Master Tour events will earn an automatic exemption into the Idaho Junior Am
- Diamond Line Player of the Year point standings
 - This is determined after the last regular season event has been played
- Qualifying at the District Championship
- Being in the top 500 on Junior Golf Scoreboard or AJGA Rankings as of July 4, 2025

TOURNAMENT REGISTRATION

Registration Opens

Registration for all Idaho Junior Tour events will open March 1st.

Juniors may register for the District Championship at this time, however they will be put on a pending approval waitlist. Starting July 1st juniors will be approved off the pending waitlist if they have meet the approved requirements.

Tournament Deadlines

Official tournament deadlines will be posted on the Junior Tour website and the tournament registration pages. All tournaments will close **10 days prior** to event at **4pm MT.**

Late Fees

Juniors missing the deadline to register have until two days past the posted deadline time to register for a \$10 late fee charge. Official deadlines will be posted on the Junior Tour website and tournament registration pages.

Juniors must contact the Idaho Junior Tour via email or phone to register late.

Withdraws and Refunds

- More than two days prior to event = Full refund minus \$5.00 credit card processing fee
- Two days prior to event = 50% refund
- 24 hours prior to event or no show = No refund

Waitlist

Juniors who miss both registration deadlines will be put on a waitlist. If a junior from your age division in your district withdraws from the event, you will be contacted by the IGA office that a spot has opened up.

Juniors will only be allowed to play in the event if they are registered through the IGA office. Juniors that show up to the course without first registering will not be allowed to play in the event.

PLAYERS RESPONSIBILITY

All players are to protect the field during tournament play. A player or player's scorekeeper (marker) must not sign a scorecard that he/she believes is incorrect.

A player shall not permit any score to be posted that he/she has evidence is incorrect. Players shall not leave the scoring area until, as a group, they reconcile, sign and attest all scorecards. Both the player and the marker may be subject to disqualification if they knowingly sign incorrect scorecards.

Please remember it is the responsibility of the players, not the parents or spectators to verify scorecards. Parents are not allowed in the scoring area. If players have difficulty confronting fellow competitors directly, the player must talk to a rules official or tournament coordinator prior to signing scorecards.

Players may not talk with parents regarding rulings or scores until AFTER the round is complete and scorecards are signed and turned in.

RULES & ETIQUETTE

The USGA Rules and interpretations of Golf will be used at each event. Rules officials and staff members will be on site to help teach and enforce the rules attempts to protect the field. Please help your child understand the basic rules and etiquette of the game. When a player is uncertain of a rule, he/she shall use the phone number provided to contact the tournament coordinator via cell phone. Rulings must be put on speaker mode for the entire group to hear.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES

The use of electronic devices (cellular telephones, Airpods, speakers, etc.) is prohibited during stipulated rounds except cellular telephones to call for a rulings for for cases of emergency. While every possible "emergency" cannot be listed specifically, the intent is that the use of these devices be limited to cases such as an illness involving the player, a fellow competitor or a member of their family.

A player in violation will receive the following: First Breach - General penalty, Second Breach - Disqualification

PACE OF PLAY

All players playing in Idaho Junior Tour events are subject to follow Pace of Play rules.

RULES OF COMPETITIONS

Play in tournaments and events conducted by the IJT are governed by the USGA Rules and Interpretations of Golf, and supplemented by the Idaho Junior Tour Tournament Rules and Conditions of Competitions, commonly referred to as the “Hard Card”. Its rules apply to all Idaho Junior Tour events. Supplemental local rules will be distributed at events accordingly.

It is the player’s responsibility to be familiar with the Rules of Golf and Idaho Junior Tour Hard Card.

DISTANCE MEASURING DEVICES

Distance measuring devices or rangefinders, will be permitted for all series and tour events. Features used to gauge other factors such as slope, wind, temperature, etc. must be disabled.

GOLF CARTS

Motorized carts are not allowed at any Idaho Junior Tour events for use by participants. Pull/push carts may be used by participants. Participants may only accept a ride when warranted by a tournament official and in designated shuttle spots at each tournament.

SPECTATOR POLICY

All parents and spectators attending Idaho Junior Tour events are subject to follow the Spectator Policy.

Idaho Junior Tour staff members have the authority to remove any spectator who is not abiding by the above policies.

The Idaho Junior Tour provides a venue for our members to participate in a game which can be pursued throughout life and which helps to develop character, sportsmanship, and the life values of integrity, honesty, self-discipline and competitive spirit.

Junior golfers are expected to comply with the following expectations throughout the tournament season, both on and off the course. Participants and spectators are expected to show good sportsmanship and proper conduct during all Idaho Junior Tour events.

Any of the below behavior will be met with severe consequences as determined by the tournament committee. Flagrant and subsequent violations will result in automatic disqualification. Repeated infractions will result in suspension. Refunds will not be given in cases of suspension.

- Disrespect of officials, course staff or tournament directors
- Throwing/slamming clubs or any players equipment
- Delay of play due to player routine
- Inappropriate language
- Inappropriate attire
- Damage to other competitors and their property
- Use of electronic devices to listen to music during round
- Use of any type of tobacco, alcohol or drugs

All players are expected to play in the spirit of the game, juniors that act in manners such as: throwing clubs, using inappropriate language on the course, damaging the course, or misbehaving will be issued the following penalties:

- 1st Offence: Warning
- 2nd Offence: General penalty (two penalty strokes)
- 3rd Offence: DQ'd

These penalties will carryover to the next events.

Idaho Junior Tour Zero-Tolerance - There is a zero-tolerance policy for cheating and damaging course property on the Idaho Junior Tour. Juniors that have been found to cheat or damage property will be automatically DQ'd from the event and will be required to sit out the next event they are registered for. Multiple infractions will result in removal from the Idaho Junior Tour for the remainder of the season.

PLAYER EXPECTATIONS

Etiquette

- Be respectful and courteous to the host course, fellow competitors and tournament staff
- Stand still and be quiet when someone is playing
- Be ready to play
- Replace divots and ball marks
- Watch errant golf shots and help search when time allows
- Use appropriate language and self regulation methods after undesirable shots

On the Tee

- Stand to the side when players are swinging
- Use a unique identification mark to identify balls

In the Sand

- Enter and exit bunkers from the low side
- Leave rakes outside of bunkers, parallel with the line of play
- Rake bunkers smooth when you are finished playing

On the Green

- Place your clubs on the side of the green nearest the next tee
- Repair ball marks
- Place a ball marker directly behind your ball
- Walk to your ball and putt without stepping or standing on anyone's line of putt

DRESS CODE

While on golf course property, players are expected to present themselves and the Idaho Junior Tour. Players are required to follow the guidelines below.

Appropriate Attire

- Boys - Sleeved, collared and tucked in shirts. Knee length shorts or long pants
- Girls - Golf appropriate tops with no low cut V-necks. Mid-thigh length shorts/skirts or long pants

Inappropriate Attire

- Tank tops, halter top, spaghetti straps, or tee shirts
- Short shorts(male or female), spandex, running/basketball shorts
- Hats worn with bill facing backwards
- Sweat pant, denim or baggy bottoms
- Undergarments/boxers showing under shorts

DIAMOND LINE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

All Idaho Junior Tour players earn points throughout the year based on how he/she places in tournaments played. These points are used to determine the point leaders for Diamond Line Player of the Year, who will qualify for the Idaho Junior Am.
